A FURTHER EXTENSION OF RESOLUTION 3 OF 2014, AS PREVIOUSLY
EXTENDED BY RESOLUTION 2 OF 2024: AGREEMENT ON THE INCREASE OF
LEVIES: PUBLIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT SECTORAL BARGAINING
COUNCIL

5.2 MS

SCOPE

This agreement binds:

1. The State as the Employer.

2. Public Health and Social Development personnel employed by the Employer who are

members of the Trade Union parties to this agreement who fall within the registered

scope of the Public Health and Social Development Sectoral Council

(PHSDSBC/Council).

3. Public Health and Social Development personnel employed by the Employer who are

not members of any Trade Union parties to this agreement but fall within the registered

scope of the Public Health and Social Development Sectoral Council

(PHSDSBC/Council).

NOTING

4. That from 01 April 2015 until 31 October 2024, the PHSDSBC has been funded by a

levy contribution of R10.00 per employee, comprising R5.00 contributed by the

employee and R5 contributed by the Employer.

5. That Resolution 3 of 2014 stipulated a review after ten (10) years from the date of its

signing.

6. That the process of reviewing Resolution 3 of 2014 remains ongoing and is unlikely to

be finalised by 31 March 2025, necessitating a further extension to ensure the

uninterrupted payment of the levies to the PHSDSBC.

7. That the levy referred to in paragraph 4 has been and shall continue to be collected

directly by the PHSDSBC via the PERSAL and PERSOL system (or any other salary

administration system of the Government).

OBJECTIVE

The objective of this Agreement is:

8. To further extend the application of The PHSDSBC Resolution 3 of 2014, as previously

extended by Resolution 2 of 2024 until 30 June 2025.

AGREEMENT

Accordingly, the parties agree as follows:

9. The levy contribution of R10.00 per employee, as established in Resolution 3 of 2014.

shall remain in effect until 30 June 2025.

10. The Employer shall continue to deduct and contribute the levies as per the existing

mechanisms.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

11. Should there be a dispute about the interpretation or application of this Agreement, the

dispute shall be resolved in accordance with the dispute resolution procedures of the

PHSDSBC.

IMPLEMENTATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE

12. This agreement shall come into effect on the date it enjoys majority support among the parties and remain in force unless terminated or amended by mutual agreement.
